Part 1: What is the Fear of God?

- Generally Commanded, often was a major playing alongside other fundamental things. In the Psalms, this is often spoken of alongside worshiping God. (31 verses, 5 NT)
 - Deuteronomy 6:13 (ESV)
¹³ It is the Lord your God you shall fear. Him you shall serve and by his name you shall swear.
 - Deuteronomy 10:20 (ESV)
²⁰ You shall fear the Lord your God. You shall serve him and hold fast to him, and by his name you shall swear.

¹² “And now, Israel, what does the Lord your God require of you, but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul,

⁴ You shall walk after the Lord your God and fear him and keep his commandments and obey his voice, and you shall serve him and hold fast to him.

 - ²⁰ That is true. They were broken off because of their unbelief, but you stand fast through faith. So do not become proud, but fear.
- A sign of adherence to being on the side of God. Basically used the same way that we say "He is a follower of Christ" (35 verses, 8 NT)
 - Genesis 42:18 (ESV)
 - ¹⁸ On the third day Joseph said to them, "Do this and you will live, for I fear God:
 - Exodus 9:30 (ESV)
 - ³⁰ But as for you and your servants, I know that you do not yet fear the Lord God."
(Moses rebukes the Egyptians for not listening to the plagues)
 - Deuteronomy 25:18 (ESV)
 - ¹⁸ how he attacked you on the way when you were faint and weary, and cut off your tail, those who were lagging behind you, and he did not fear God.
 - Judges 7:3 (ESV)

- ³ Now therefore proclaim in the ears of the people, saying, ‘Whoever is fearful and trembling, let him return home and hurry away from Mount Gilead.’ ” Then 22,000 of the people returned, and 10,000 remained.
- 1 Kings 18:3 (ESV)

³ And Ahab called Obadiah, who was over the household. (Now Obadiah feared the Lord greatly,
 - 1 Kings 18:12 (ESV)

¹² And as soon as I have gone from you, the Spirit of the Lord will carry you I know not where. And so, when I come and tell Ahab and he cannot find you, he will kill me, although I your servant have feared the Lord from my youth.
 - 2 Kings 4:1 (ESV)

Now the wife of one of the sons of the prophets cried to Elisha, “Your servant my husband is dead, and you know that your servant feared the Lord, but the creditor has come to take my two children to be his slaves.”

¹⁶ Better is a little with the fear of the Lord
 than great treasure and trouble with it.
 - Proverbs 31:30 (ESV)
³⁰ Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain,
 but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.
 - Isaiah 33:6 (ESV)
⁶ and he will be the stability of your times,
 abundance of salvation, wisdom, and knowledge;

the fear of the Lord is Zion's treasure.

- Jeremiah 2:19 (ESV)
¹⁹ Your evil will chastise you,
and your apostasy will reprove you.
Know and see that it is evil and bitter
for you to forsake the Lord your God;
the fear of me is not in you,
declares the Lord God of hosts.
- An activity rewarded by God, or punishable if not adhered. Job shows us that this is not a hard and fast rule. (31-2 verses, 2 NT)
 - Exodus 1:21 (ESV)
²¹ And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families.
 - Deuteronomy 5:29 (ESV)
²⁹ Oh that they had such a heart as this always, to fear me and to keep all my commandments, that it might go well with them and with their descendants forever!
 - 1 Samuel 12:14 (ESV)
¹⁴ If you will fear the Lord and serve him and obey his voice and not rebel against the commandment of the Lord, and if both you and the king who reigns over you will follow the Lord your God, it will be well.
 - 2 Samuel 23:3 (ESV)
³ The God of Israel has spoken;
the Rock of Israel has said to me:
When one rules justly over men,
ruling in the fear of God, (Context explains this further)
 - 2 Kings 17:25 (ESV)
²⁵ And at the beginning of their dwelling there, they did not fear the Lord. Therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which killed some of them.
 - 2 Chronicles 26:5 (ESV)
⁵ He set himself to seek God in the days of Zechariah, who instructed him in the fear of God, and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him prosper.
 - Nehemiah 1:11 (ESV)
¹¹ O Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of your servant, and to the prayer of your servants who delight to fear your name, and give success to your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man."
Now I was cupbearer to the king.

and do not join with those who do otherwise, (v. 22 "for disaster will arise suddenly from them, and who knows the ruin that will come from them both?")

¹⁴ Blessed is the one who fears the Lord always,
but whoever hardens his heart will fall into calamity.
- Jeremiah 26:19 (ESV)

¹⁹ Did Hezekiah king of Judah and all Judah put him to death? Did he not fear the Lord and entreat the favor of the Lord, and did not the Lord relent of the disaster that he had pronounced against them? But we are about to bring great disaster upon ourselves."

- Jeremiah 44:10 (ESV)
¹⁰ They have not humbled themselves even to this day, nor have they feared, nor walked in my law and my statutes that I set before you and before your fathers. (the following verse speaks of God's judgment because of this.)

for we do not fear the Lord;
and a king—what could he do for us?"

⁵ "Then I will draw near to you for judgment. I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired worker in his wages, the widow and the fatherless, against those who thrust aside the sojourner, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.
- Malachi 4:2 (ESV)
² But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.
- Luke 1:50 (ESV)
⁵⁰ And his mercy is for those who fear him
from generation to generation.
- Revelation 11:18 (ESV)
¹⁸ The nations raged,
but your wrath came,
and the time for the dead to be judged,

and for destroying the destroyers of the earth." (Proclaimed after God gains dominion over earth.)
- A quality of leadership (3 verses)
 - Exodus 18:21 (ESV)

- ²¹ Moreover, look for able men from all the people, men who fear God, who are trustworthy and hate a bribe, and place such men over the people as chiefs of thousands, of hundreds, of fifties, and of tens.
- 2 Samuel 23:3 (ESV)
 - ³ The God of Israel has spoken;
 - the Rock of Israel has said to me:
 - When one rules justly over men,
 - ruling in the fear of God,
 - Nehemiah 7:2 (ESV)
 - ² I gave my brother Hanani and Hananiah the governor of the castle charge over Jerusalem, for he was a more faithful and God-fearing man than many.
 - Compared with proper treatment of others (10-2 verses, 1 NT)
 - Leviticus 19:14 (ESV)
 - ¹⁴ You shall not curse the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind, but you shall fear your God: I am the Lord.
 - Leviticus 19:32 (ESV)
 - ³² “You shall stand up before the gray head and honor the face of an old man, and you shall fear your God: I am the Lord.
 - Leviticus 25:17 (ESV)
 - ¹⁷ You shall not wrong one another, but you shall fear your God, for I am the Lord your God.
 - Leviticus 25:36 (ESV)
 - ³⁶ Take no interest from him or profit, but fear your God, that your brother may live beside you.
 - Leviticus 25:43 (ESV)
 - ⁴³ You shall not rule over him ruthlessly but shall fear your God.
 - 2 Samuel 23:3 (ESV)
 - ³ The God of Israel has spoken;
 - the Rock of Israel has said to me:
 - When one rules justly over men,
 - ruling in the fear of God,
 - 2 Chronicles 19:7 (ESV)
 - ⁷ Now then, let the fear of the Lord be upon you. Be careful what you do, for there is no injustice with the Lord our God, or partiality or taking bribes.”
 - 2 Chronicles 19:9 (ESV)
 - ⁹ And he charged them: “Thus you shall do in the fear of the Lord, in faithfulness, and with your whole heart: (about appointing judges over people)
 - Job 6:14 (ESV)
 - ¹⁴ “He who withholds kindness from a friend
 - forsakes the fear of the Almighty.
 - Luke 18:2 (ESV) (Also Luke 18:4)
 - ² He said, “In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor respected man.
 - The Old Covenant was characterized by fear of God and also peace, interestingly. (1 verse)

- Malachi 2:5 (ESV)
 - ⁵ My covenant with him was one of life and peace, and I gave them to him. It was a covenant of fear, and he feared me. He stood in awe of my name.
- Our fear of God should be even greater than Old Testament fear (1 verse)
 - Hebrews 12:21 (ESV)
 - ²¹ Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, “I tremble with fear.” This whole passage compares how the Israelites feared what they could not even approach. But we have approached it! Interestingly, this is shortly after the Hebrews 10 passage of drawing near.
- This kind of fear is used in other contexts. Most of them are negative (Do not include these verses in the verse count for fearing God)
 - Judges 6:10 (ESV)
 - ¹⁰ And I said to you, ‘I am the Lord your God; you shall not fear the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell.’ But you have not obeyed my voice.”
 - 1 Samuel 14:26 (ESV)
 - ²⁶ And when the people entered the forest, behold, the honey was dropping, but no one put his hand to his mouth, for the people feared the oath. (Saul's rash oath)
 - Numbers 14:9 (ESV)
 - ⁹ Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not fear the people of the land, for they are bread for us. Their protection is removed from them, and the Lord is with us; do not fear them.”
 - 1 Samuel 15:24 (ESV)
 - ²⁴ Saul said to Samuel, “I have sinned, for I have transgressed the commandment of the Lord and your words, because I feared the people and obeyed their voice.
 - 1 Samuel 18:15 (ESV)
 - ¹⁵ And when Saul saw that he had great success, he stood in fearful awe of him.
 - 2 Kings 17:7 (ESV)
 - ⁷ And this occurred because the people of Israel had sinned against the Lord their God, who had brought them up out of the land of Egypt from under the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and had feared other gods
 - Esther 5:9 (ESV)
 - ⁹ And Haman went out that day joyful and glad of heart. But when Haman saw Mordecai in the king’s gate, that he neither rose nor trembled before him, he was filled with wrath against Mordecai. (It seems that this was a common cultural thing to do before Kings)
 - Psalm 139:14 (ESV)
 - ¹⁴ I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.
Wonderful are your works;
my soul knows it very well.
 - Proverbs 29:25 (ESV)
 - ²⁵ The fear of man lays a snare,
but whoever trusts in the Lord is safe.
 - Isaiah 8:12 (ESV)
 - ¹² Do not call conspiracy all that this people calls conspiracy, and do not fear what they fear, nor be in dread. (Next verse says to "let God be your fear" instead.)

- Daniel 1:10 (ESV)
¹⁰ and the chief of the eunuchs said to Daniel, "I fear my lord the king, who assigned your food and your drink; for why should he see that you were in worse condition than the youths who are of your own age? So you would endanger my head with the king."
- Daniel 5:19 (ESV)
¹⁹ And because of the greatness that he gave him, all peoples, nations, and languages trembled and feared before him. Whom he would, he killed, and whom he would, he kept alive; whom he would, he raised up, and whom he would, he humbled.
- Daniel 10:8 (ESV)
⁸ So I was left alone and saw this great vision, and no strength was left in me. My radiant appearance was fearfully changed, and I retained no strength.
- Habakkuk 3:2 (ESV)

² O Lord, I have heard the report of you,
and your work, O Lord, do I fear.
In the midst of the years revive it;
in the midst of the years make it known;
in wrath remember mercy.

- Romans 13:3 (ESV)
³ For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, (Speaking about earthly authorities that God has put in power)
 - 1 Corinthians 2:3 (ESV)
³ And I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling,
 - Jude 23 (ESV)
 - ²³ save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh. (Probably means to show mercy with caution)
 - 1 Samuel 28:5 (ESV)
⁵ When Saul saw the army of the Philistines, he was afraid, and his heart trembled greatly.
- A typical positive form of "fear" apart from fearing God is when foreigners fear Israel (Do not include these verses in the verse count for fearing God)
 - 1 Kings 8:43 (ESV)
⁴³ hear in heaven your dwelling place and do according to all for which the foreigner calls to you, in order that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and fear you, as do your people Israel, and that they may know that this house that I have built is called by your name. (In this instance, the foreigner is treated well by Israel and therefore fears Israel. Interesting!)
 - 1 Chronicles 14:17 (ESV)
¹⁷ And the fame of David went out into all lands, and the Lord brought the fear of him upon all nations.

- Esther 8:17 (ESV)

¹⁷ And in every province and in every city, wherever the king's command and his edict reached, there was gladness and joy among the Jews, a feast and a holiday. And many from the peoples of the country declared themselves Jews, for fear of the Jews had fallen on them.
- Acts 16:29 (ESV)

²⁹ And the jailer called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas.
- 2 Samuel 22:46 (ESV)

⁴⁶ Foreigners lost heart and came trembling out of their fortresses.
- The beginning of wisdom and knowledge (5 verses)
 - Psalm 111:10 (ESV)

¹⁰ The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!
 - Proverbs 1:7 (ESV)
- ⁷ The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.
 - Proverbs 1:29 (ESV)

²⁹ Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the Lord, (Those who did not listen to God or seek knowledge)
 - Proverbs 9:10 (ESV)

¹⁰ The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.
 - Proverbs 15:33 (ESV)

³³ The fear of the Lord is instruction in wisdom, and humility comes before honor.

Part 2: What does the Fear of God do?

- To keep people from sinning, and cause them to obey God (24 verses, 6 NT)

¹⁷ But the steadfast love of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting on those who fear him,
and his righteousness to children's children,
 - Psalm 147:11 (ESV)
¹¹ but the Lord takes pleasure in those who fear him,
in those who hope in his steadfast love.

² All these things my hand has made,
and so all these things came to be,
declares the Lord.
But this is the one to whom I will look:

Part 3: How do we Learn to Fear God?

- Accomplished by obeying God's word (15 verses)
 - Exodus 9:20-21
²⁰ Then whoever feared the word of the LORD among the servants of Pharaoh hurried his slaves and his livestock into the houses, ²¹ but whoever did not pay attention to the word of the LORD left his slaves and his livestock in the field.
 - Deuteronomy 6:2 (ESV)
² that you may fear the Lord your God, you and your son and your son's son, by keeping all his statutes and his commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be long.
 - Deuteronomy 8:6 (ESV)
⁶ So you shall keep the commandments of the Lord your God by walking in his ways and by fearing him.
 - 2 Kings 17:25 (ESV)
²⁵ And at the beginning of their dwelling there, they did not fear the Lord. Therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which killed some of them. (The next verses have someone telling the King of Assyria that these people were killed because they "do not know the Law of God in the land.")
 - 2 Kings 17:28 (ESV)
²⁸ So one of the priests whom they had carried away from Samaria came and lived in Bethel and taught them how they should fear the Lord. (A response to 2 Kings 17:25)

³² They also feared the LORD and appointed from among themselves all sorts of people as priests of the high places, who sacrificed for them in the shrines of the high places. ³³ So they feared the LORD but also served their own gods, after the manner of the nations from among whom they had been carried away.

They do not fear the LORD, and they do not follow the statutes or the rules or the law or the commandment that the LORD commanded the children of Jacob, whom he named Israel. ³⁵ The LORD made a covenant with them and commanded them, "You shall not fear other gods or bow yourselves to them or serve them or sacrifice to them, ³⁶ but you shall fear the LORD, who brought you out of the land of Egypt with great power and with an outstretched arm. You shall bow yourselves to him, and to him you shall sacrifice. ³⁷ And the statutes and the rules and the law and the commandment that he wrote for you, you shall always be careful to do. You shall not fear other gods, ³⁸ and you shall not forget the covenant that I have made with you. You shall not fear other gods, ³⁹ but you shall fear the LORD your God, and he will deliver you out of

the hand of all your enemies.” 40 However, they would not listen, but they did according to their former manner.

41 So these nations feared the LORD and also served their carved images. Their children did likewise, and their children’s children—as their fathers did, so they do to this day.

³⁹ I will give them one heart and one way, that they may fear me forever, for their own good and the good of their children after them. ⁴⁰ I will make with them an everlasting covenant, that I will not turn away from doing good to them. And I will put the fear of me in their hearts, that they may not turn from me.
